Diverse Suppliers refer to those organizations and companies that identify as minority-owned, women-owned, veteran-owned, LGBT-owned, service- disabled veteran-owned, historically underutilized business, and Small Business Administration-defined small business.

A **Supplier Diversity Program** is a proactive business program which encourages the use of minority-owned, women owned, veteran owned, LGBT-owned, service- disabled veteran-owned, historically underutilized business, and Small Business Administration-defined small businesses as suppliers.

Why is this pillar important? Diverse suppliers can be agile, cost-effective and innovative resources for companies to consider conducting business within a supply chain. U.S. demographics show that minority and women-owned companies are growing in numbers along with the changing face of the consumer. Many of these companies offer specific expertise in product and business development that is inaccessible to an organization without the lived experience and subject matter expertise they possess. In the global marketplace, supplier diversity is considered a competitive advantage and connection to the international economy. Recent emphasis on social equity efforts also encourages the utilization of diverse suppliers.
